## MICHIGAN HUMANE, PETSMART CHARITIES LAUNCH PROGRAM TO BENEFIT DETROIT RESIDENTS

A \$45,000 grant from PetSmart Charities provides essential funding for the new initiative.

(DATE), DETROIT, MI- A joint effort from Michigan Humane and PetSmart Charities® will see the launch of a comprehensive initiative to support Detroit residents' access to veterinary medicine and pet care resources beginning in January 2021.

"We're continually evolving as an organization and the next step is to expand our existing relationships with animal lovers in our community. This initiative will help us better understand how to engage with our neighbors and tailor our services to meet the needs of the community," says Matthew Pepper, Michigan Humane president and CEO.

The Access to Care program will engage the assistance of Letty Azar, who has over 20 years of experience in senior health care and human services. Azar most recently served under the Duggan administration in the city of Detroit as the Department of Neighborhood's District 4 Manager, focusing on community engagement and city services for the residents of Detroit's far east side neighborhoods.

Azar shared this regarding her decision to partner with Michigan Humane on this work: "Access to preventive health care and food insecurity sadly are long standing issues in low-income communities and when one person in the home is vulnerable, we know others residing there are as well, to include our pets. The opportunity to support Michigan Humane's development of an access to care model for our most vulnerable citizens and their pets isn't just rewarding, it's one of the most comprehensive and impactful programs I've had the honor to work on."

Ms. Azar will work with the residents and community leaders of Detroit's Warrendale neighborhood to determine the ways in which Michigan Humane can best deliver services and support. This initial phase of the program is made possible through a grant from PetSmart Charities.

"We know that making the effort to understand the specific needs of communities will allow better service to the pets and people in that community," said Kelly Balthazor, regional relationship manager at PetSmart Charities. "We are proud to support the development of the Michigan Humane Access to Care program, which will provide additional critical resources to thousands of pets and people in Detroit."

The information gathering portion of the project is expected to take between six to nine months and will form the basis of programs developed to increase the access to care for pet owners in Warrendale. Michigan Humane anticipates connecting with approximately 3,000 residents to determine their pet-related needs. The overall goal of the project is to develop a sustainable model for pet owners to connect with resources for the companion animals that they share their lives with.

Michigan Humane already has several programs through which metro residents can request support for their companion animals including the pet pantry, the One Health medical care initiative and Operation DINGO, which is a partnership with Detroit Animal Care and Control to support pet owners. The organization also, in partnership with Strategic Staffing Solutions, continues to provide focused outreach efforts in the North End neighborhood through the Pets for Life program.
