

PET PANTRY GUIDELINES

Michigan Humane is pleased to offer temporary support and assistance to Michigan pet-owners in need. Here are some important considerations to keep in mind as you join our program:

- When available, we offer free dog and cat food, cat litter, and pet supplies.
- Our operations are based on the donations of others; therefore, we cannot guarantee that any specific type of food or pet supplies will consistently be available.
- You are eligible to pick up pet food every thirty days.
- Each household is limited to one bag of pet food for each species of animal that lives in the home.
- A member of each household must be present to receive pet food, as we do not allow anyone to pick up food for households other than their own.
- This program is supplementary and is not intended to be the sole provider of support for your pets, pet owners must be prepared to always provide food and veterinary care for their pets.
- It is our goal to see all animals (under the age of 8) in our program sterilized (fixed). Please ask our team for more information regarding spay and neuter appointments for your pet.
- Breeding or planning to breed your pet will result in immediate removal from the program.
- Participation in the Pet Pantry may be revoked for disruptive behavior including inappropriate language, violence or threat of violence, and hostile behavior towards Michigan Humane staff, volunteers, clients, and affiliates.
- Pet food and supplies received from the Pet Pantry should not be resold or redistributed for any circumstance.
- Registration and participation in the Pet Pantry Program may be revoked at the discretion of Michigan Humane for any reason.
- At the staff's discretion, Michigan Humane employees may visit your home to provide resources or to ensure your participation follows our program guidelines.
